CA-R-MA IS PERSISTENT

When working with feral cats, patience is a necessity. In the case of one large colony of nearly 30 cats, two Ca-r-ma Charlotte County volunteers have coordinated and worked with local caregivers for two years in an ongoing effort to see that all are trapped, neutered/spayed and returned. They are now cared for and have a shed for shelter.

These cats are not adoptable, but kittens are not born feral, so Ca-r-ma volunteers are on the lookout for kittens less than two months old who can be socialized and see a better life in a home.

This is only one of the 20 colonies Ca-r-ma Charlotte County is currently working with. This year 227 cats have been neutered/spayed, as of the end of September. Since 2008 the Chapter has neutered/spayed 1,912 cats. No longer does the area's shelter receive overwhelming calls to take kittens, and the colonies of cats are healthier. We help

out with food, medical attention and shelter. We are bringing community cat populations into balance and preventing more unwanted kittens, through our trap-neuter-return programs. Plus we are improving the lives of cats living in these colonies.

KITTENS IN DANGER AT INDUSTRIAL SITE

Sometimes there is a special warmth with a rescue. Recently two kittens and one young adult cat were rescued from a dangerous industrial workplace. When a caring employee found one kitten dead, he knew he had to act fast to save the other three, who were picking for food in the chemical dumpster. He contacted Ca-r-ma, and within three days, using the Ca-r-ma Charlotte County traps, he had trapped the kittens.

These kittens were neutered/spayed and are now living in a foster home.

Industrial sites are dangerous places for community cats, and Ca-r-ma encourages both individuals and businesses to work with the organization to find the best solutions for these cats.

TWO COLONIES, SEVEN KITTENS AND ONE PATIENT FOSTER PERSON

When a Ca-r-ma volunteer was alerted to young kittens in two rural colonies, they were placed with an experienced empathetic foster person. She worked for several weeks with these skittish, almost feral cats. She needed to encourage them to come out from hiding. Her patience and persistence were eventually rewarded and the kittens have been accepted at the CCSPCA shelter for adoption.

Ca-r-ma Charlotte County works side-by-side with the CCSPCA shelter, pet stores and cat foster homes to adopt out friendly cats from colonies.



OCTOBER ADOPTATHON WITH PETVALU




